### Soup Kitchen 4 a Day

Students discover social justice knowledge and values, critically assess their beliefs and take action to support those in need with Soup Kitchen 4 a Day. This flexible programme is based on the Global Citizenship Education model of Learn – Think – Act.

The Soup Kitchen 4 a Day resource pack includes discussion activities, short video clips, role play scenarios and information about the realities of daily life at the Compassion Soup Kitchen.

Students can then get creative and run their own pop-up Soup Kitchen, can drive, bake sale or cooking competition to support the Compassion Soup Kitchen.
